

KS2 Online Safety Guidance

Rules

- Respect each other
- Use google classroom like a real classroom
- Do not post silly videos
- General posts can be created however do not spam
- No foul language
- No text speak
- Do not share personal information, Xbox or Playstation gamer tags etc

Think Twice

Think twice about everything that you say online. Don't give away your real name, address, which school you go to or which clubs you are in

Block it

- Block it if something looks odd, it probably is
- Block and delete emails from people you do not know
- Do not open any attachments from people you do not know as it could be a nasty virus
- If anyone sends a nasty email or message, just block them and tell an adult. This applies to all devices such as game consoles

Flag it

Flag up anything that is not right. This means tell someone you trust- they might be able to help get something done about it

These may include

- Cyber bullying
- Someone asking to meet up with you in real life
- Anything that upsets or worries you
- Anything that you think might be illegal

Cyberbullying

- Cyberbullying is no different to bullying in real life. You do not need to put up with it. If someone says something that upsets you, tell someone you trust about it such as a teacher or parent or block the bully
- Keep any evidence to share with a trusted adult
- Also think before you send a message- is it kind?

Meeting people offline

- Never meet anyone from the internet without an adult with you as this is very dangerous
- Remember people may not be who they say they are. Anyone can upload a photo of someone else and call themselves by a different name, age and interests
- Talk to a trusted adult if anyone has asked to meet you in real life

Remember not to spend too long on digital devices such as ipads and games consoles- have a digital balance
