

# Flanimals and Famimals

This activity sheet is based on a book called Flanimals by Ricky Gervais. Flanimals are strange creatures that lived in different place and at a different time.





## **Funny story**

Write a Flanimals inspired story together.

Agree on a title, then one family member starts the story by writing the first paragraph. Another member of the family continues the story by writing the next paragraph, and so on. You can do this at different times of the day and everyone in your family can contribute; it's ok to help each other if you need to.

Once you have written the story, read it out together so everyone can listen.
